



#### Observation: Genesis 11:27-12:9


- Abram's relatives
- Ur -> Haran -> Canaan
- Terah dies in Haran
- God's call (commands)
- God's promises
- Abram obeys, builds altars, calls on YHWH
- Abram keeps moving
