Question Mashup #1:

How can parents *and educators* provide children with biblical guidance and teaching while also teaching them how to show love and compassion and without losing sight of what the Bible says



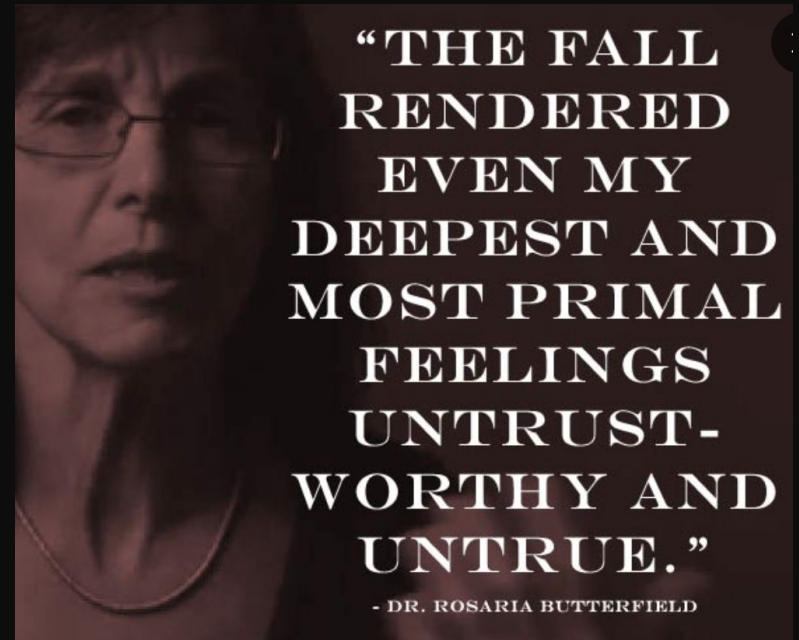
Question Mashup #2:

Homosexuality/transgenderism has become a highly political issue. Do the official platforms and actual policies of the Republican and Democratic parties differ on this topic? If so, how, and what does this mean practically for the discerning Christian? How should we engage with the culture?



Question #3:

Is the homosexual attraction itself a sin or is it only when it is acted upon?



Question #4:

Is "conversion therapy" a valid avenue for homosexuals or is it dangerous and harmful as many say?

Question #5:

If a Christian struggles with same-sex attraction or gender dysphoria, what should he do? And what can the church do for believers caught up in these struggles?

Question Mashup #6:

How do we respond to people who claim that signs of homosexuality can be seen in young children, even as young as 3 or 4?

One may say: "If homosexuality is wrong, then why have I felt homosexual attraction from as young as I can remember? Why would God have made me like this?"



Question #7:

David and Jonathan are mentioned by some progressive Christians as an example of homosexual relation. Could you comment on this.
